Our Mindfulness work has also been very successful and has helped the children to develop positive thinking and attitudes. This week, all Chapter 2 classes have visited our Forest School, which is always a highlight. There was some great teamwork and it ended with a muddiest hands competition, which was enjoyed by all!

<u>Chapter 3</u>

This week in Chapter 3, the children's hard work, learning and performing a variety of songs, came to fruition at the Young Voices concert in Manchester. Children have also continued to exchange letters with their year 5 pen pals. It has been joyous to see beautiful friendships flourish across the year groups, with children showing such interest and care in their writing.

<u>Chapter 4</u>

We have had a great last week in LC+ in Year 4. We began with some more Italian lessons, this time thinking about Italian music and listening to some too. We did our toughest Joe Wicks workout yet, and spoke afterwards about the importance of applying ourselves and seeing something through, even when it's very difficult to do. Our week ended with a visit from an Italian speaker who taught us about the festival of Carnival, and when showed us how to make a special mask!

<u>Chapter 6</u>

We come to the end busy half-term in year 6 in terms of LC+. We have spent the half-term learning about how to manage out money and be responsible with it. The children have formed a knowledge of how debt can be caused and where to avoid bad debt. They have shown an excellent understanding and really involved themselves in the case studies that were looked at. The children across the year group all took part in dance and drama with Mrs Whitehead. This culminated with a brilliant contemporary haka hybrid dance for class 6P in the final lesson. Children continued with restorative thinking with Ms Morgan and learned more about how to think about each other and treat others. In addition to all of this, there were other topics covered that will continue in some capacity throughout the year. Miss Tyrer introduced her class to manga art and the style and techniques that can be used there to create art in this genre. Additionally children across the three classes have been learning about mindfulness and how they can help themselves. This has been an enjoyable topic to teach and will continue throughout the year.


We've had some great responses and we're looking to put on an amazing talent show to end the summer term!
