Conclusion

In Key Stage I and 4, attainment of Pupil Premium pupils exceeds the National Average in all performance measures for the last 3 years, although it has to be said that our numbers are relatively small. This is also true for Key Stage 2 with the exception of 2016. In real terms one out of the three students did not reach expected standard in all six areas. This underachievement is being addressed within the development plan for 2016-17.
