How many subjects?

- The majority of students will ultimately take 3 subjects.
- Some will take 4 subjects at the start and then drop one once a final choice has been made.

Entry requirements

- Five GCSE passes at grades 5
- Retail Business and Computing BTEC
- a Level 2 merit is needed
- Minimum grade 4 in maths
- Minimum grade 4 in English Language or Literature
- Plus subject specific requirements

Entry examples

- MATHS Grade 7 in GCSE Maths.
- POLITICS Grade 6 in History, Geography or an English GCSE.
