Liverpool College Students Achieve Engineering Excellence - Award Ceremony Success!

If you were an Engineer, what would you do? This was the question posed to 700 students ranging from Year 2 to Year 10 as part of a national Engineering competition this year, a project designed to find the next promising UK inventor. Beating over 70,000 students nationwide, Liverpool College students celebrated massive success on Wednesday, culminating in an award ceremony at Liverpool Edge Hill University.

The designs of winning young engineer, and those highly commended, were displayed in a wonderful gallery on campus, followed by a superb award ceremony at the University. Budding STEM stars were presented with trophies, badges and certificates by industry experts in Engineering fields. As part of the award ceremony, every students' work was also individually displayed, discussed and celebrated on the big screen – watched on by invited family and friends.

This year Liverpool College had ten year-group category winners and a further ten runner-up highly commended entries - the highest number from any one school in the entire North West!

The Winning Young Engineers were: Alexander Dean (Year 3), Julia Van Der Hoel and Sienna Singh (Year 7), Orla Dearman and Tanvir Hossain (Year 8), Aiden Harper and Bailie Hutchinson (Year 9) and Jeffrey Lai and Orla Cummings (Year 10)

Receiving Runner Up 'Highly Commended' awards were: Jack Grimes (Y2), Noah Mather (Y4), Mia Ford and Noah Jolley (Y7), Dareen Matojeni and Arad Enshaeian (Y8), Lois Hardisty and Amy Garden (Y9) and Jack Traynor and Charlie Park (Y10).

To participate in the competition, pupils had to identify a problem they had observed in real life, invent a solution to that problem, illustrate and annotate their creation, promote their product through a descriptive 'Pitch Letter' and meet a real engineer. We had over 750 students participating in this incredible creative thinking design engineering competition, co-ordinated across the whole school by Mrs Doran. Well done to all who entered this year - the standard from Liverpool College was described as absolutely phenomenal b the judges!



Year 5 French Olympic Games

Year 5 had lots of fun on Tuesday finding about the Olympic Games. The pupils learned about the history of the Olympics with Mr Pepper; had a French session to try out a different language with Madame Jones; they took part in a mini Olympic Games with Mr Rogerson and had a session about Paris and some Olympic themed craft with their form teachers. 
