Reception Road Safety

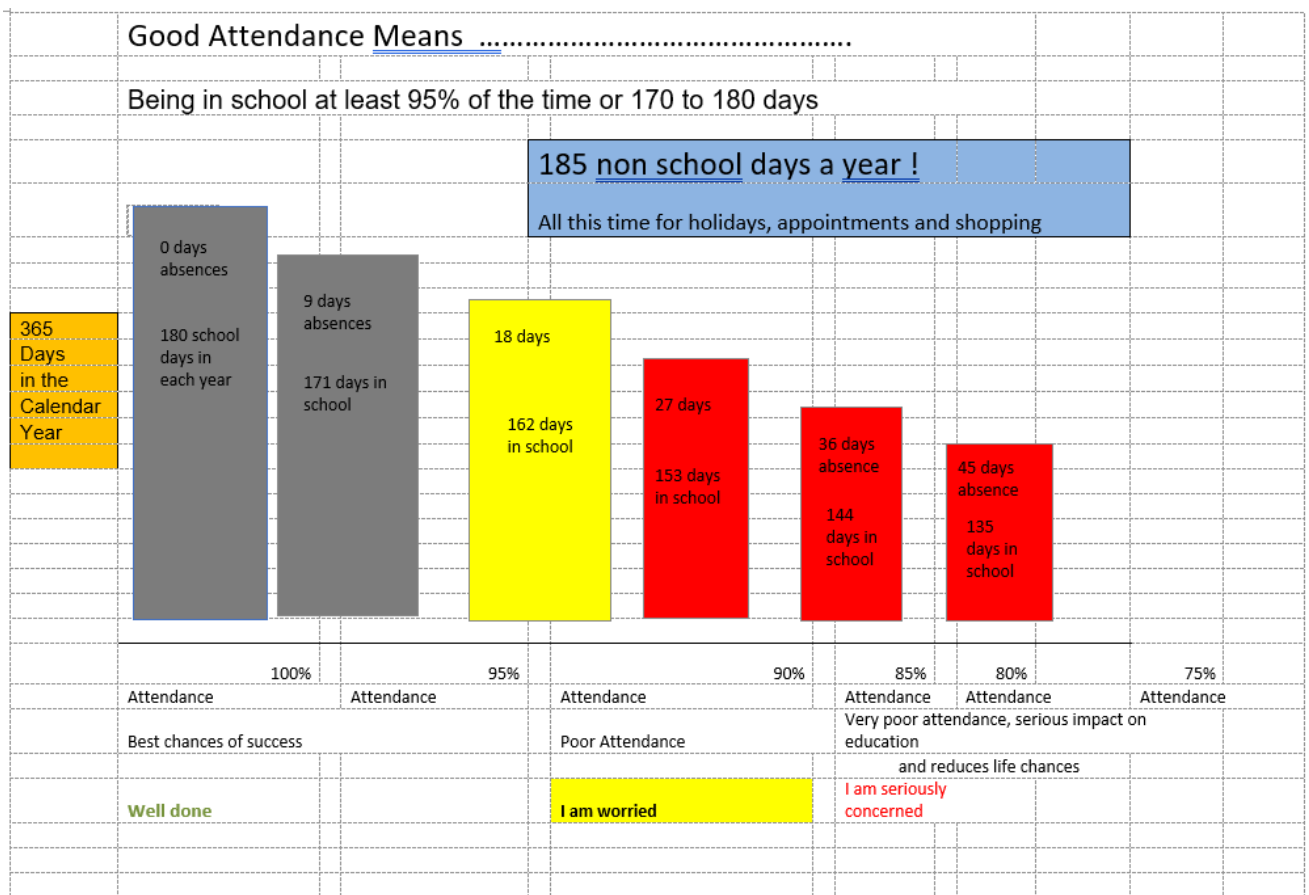

PE Kit

Full school tracksuit, white polo t-shirt, black skirt or black shorts, white socks, trainers, black pumps for gymnastics. **No leggings allowed**

Games Kit

Uniform C - **Full school tracksuit**, white polo t-shirt, black skirt, , white socks for netball, trainers, red and black school socks, mouthguard and shin pads for hockey.

Uniform L - **Full school tracksuit**, red and black school rugby top, black shorts, , red and black school rugby socks, trainers, football boots.

Equipment - gumshields and shin-pads are essential for games and activities

Last week, our Year 6 (and a couple of Year 5s!) contact rugby team made the very short trip over to the Upper School fields to take on our very own Year 7s. It was brilliant to see some old familiar faces, and some very talented new ones, amongst their squad. After a thorough warm up, we began the game, under the careful and helpful watch of coach/ref Mr Heeley. The first 10 minutes didn't go as planned.
