

On Tuesday, our Year 5 & 6 Cricket team made the short journey to Sefton Park Cricket Club for the annual LSSP tournament. Picking the team was hard enough, such is the depth of cricket talent on offer in our school right now, so some very talented players had to unfortunately miss out. The squad we did take more than delivered on the day, they were absolutely outstanding. They won every single league game, with winning margins of 92, 120, 14, and a whopping 122 runs across the 4 matches! This then placed us into the final against St Mary's, a repeat of last year's final. Thankfully, once again we were able to triumph, in a closely fought game, meaning we defended our crown as champions and brought home some silverware!
