CHARLIE AND THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY

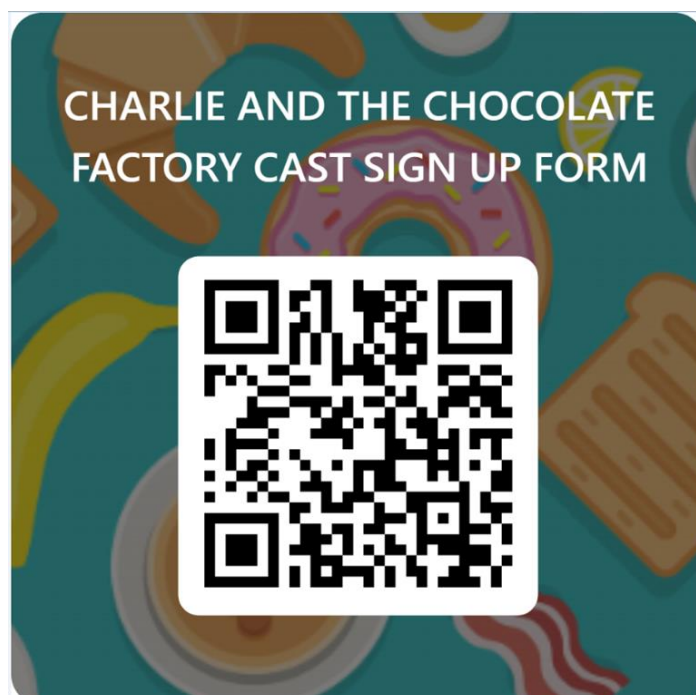
IT'S FINALLY HERE - This years' school play is all things chocolate and Wonka! It's Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.

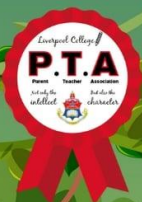
