Price for the full term for all groups is: £66 (£6 X 11 Sessions).

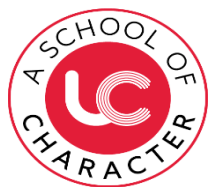

LC+ Round Up – Spring Term 2!



This half term, we have been practising mindfulness and yoga. Supported by Cosmic Yoga, we have taken part in lots of different themes including Little Red Riding Hood, Shapes and Easter. It has helped us to understand keeping our bodies and minds healthy, and to support our listening, attention and focus too. We noticed that when we breathe, our bodies and minds calm down and we can feel our heart beating. Some of us also noticed that our bodies make interesting noises (and smells!) when we do stretches too.

Year 1

In year 1, pupils have explored British Sign Language; we've learnt the BSL signs for greetings, animals, feelings and colours. Additionally, the year 1 pupils have enjoyed exploring our outdoor equipment and play resources within our gross-motor exercise sessions; we've focussed on teamwork activities, climbing, balancing, hopping, running, hoop control and ball games!

Year 2

This half-term, Year 2 have been focusing on enhancing their teamwork skills while solving problems and challenges. The children particularly loved playing the swamp game, whereby they had to work as a team to get from one end of the swamp to the other. The catch was that the swamp was filled with crocodiles, and the children could only get across by stepping on stepping stones (hula hoops). Initially, many children threw the stepping stones too far ahead and failed to jump onto them, which meant they had to start again. Quickly, they realised that working methodically, together as a team, was the best approach to this challenge. This game was 2R's class favourite, and they regularly ask to play it again.



Year 3

This half term Chapter 3 have been talking about keeping safe and what to do and who to call in an emergency. They have learnt some first aid skills and how to treat bite and stings. They also worked hard for their class assemblies on reading, volcanoes and maths.

Year 4

For Year 4, LC+ in the Spring term has involved exercise, music and the Forest! We split our time into 2 parts during the first half term where we transformed our classrooms into a workout area, suitable for Joe Wicks HITT workouts. We took things seriously and started our Thursday mornings with a bang! Burpees, squats, press up, planks, you name it, we did it. The second half of our LC+ sessions were much more tranquil as we learnt familiar songs on the glockenspiel. Working with partners, the children followed colour coded patterns and took turns to perform musical pieces including hot cross buns and London Bridge is falling down. It was bliss!

This half term, in LC+, we have all enjoyed exploring nature down in Forest School. The children love their free time to explore, play games and make Nature Art, but they were also given opportunities to work safely with a craftsman's knife to do some whittling.

Finally, we have Time to Shine! The children have loved to share achievements, perform dances and football skills. It's been a great term of working together and supporting one another in different areas of learning.



Year 5

In Year 5, we have been learning the basics of another language aside from our usual Spanish lessons - Italian! We have considered the geography of Italy (and can now all spot 'the boot', as well as Italian culture. Within this, we had the chance to taste a number of foods, including garlic (a staple ingredient in a lot of Italian cooking) which some of us even enjoyed eating raw, despite the facial expressions which said otherwise! The olives and gnocchi were a little hit and miss, but the pizza flavoured breadsticks were a firm favourite for the majority of us! We also had some really interesting and thought-provoking debates, ranging from children's use of devices, whether we should bring pets to school, and if zoos should be banned!

Year 6

In Year 6, we have continued to learn about how to manage our money and looking ahead to things such as when it may be considered sensible to take out a loan or when a debt may be foolish. We have then moved onto looking at languages that use different alphabets than our own such as Greek and have looked at how their alphabet worked and then used it to decipher codes and find messages.

The children in year 6 also enjoyed a fabulous forensics workshop which helped them with their investigative skills. We have also had many members of the year group take part in the production of the school play. This included roles as actors, in the band, backstage or helping with the props and the technology team
