Pre-Prep Book Fair


The book fair will be arriving at Pre-Prep on Tuesday 17th March until Thursday 19th March.

Have a chat

Research shows that children who engage regularly in conversational turn-taking with an adult learn faster when they're older. Taking every opportunity to chat with your child will help them build the language and vocabulary skills they need for school. Let your child pick the topic they want to talk about, listen to them, ask questions and share your ideas. You can do this anywhere and at any time, and you'll learn a lot about your child's interests! You can also use everyday activities to spark a conversation with your child, such as getting dressed or going to the park.

Important Notice for All Parents/Carers

Liverpool City Council have painted a single yellow line on Queens Drive opposite the prep school gates. The Highway Code states, you must not wait or park on single yellow lines during the "times of operation", the times of operation are indicated on the signs.

At home time today the traffic was blocked for 20 minutes and an ambulance couldn't get through.

Yellow lines are placed on the road because, if vehicles were permitted to park there it would cause an obstruction. By ignoring the single yellow lines and parking there you are putting yourself and other motorists and vehicles at risk.

Parents/Carers must not use the Prep car park to drop off or pick pupils including from After School Club.
