Well done to the following pupils who were given Headteacher's Award certificates this week.



With medals hanging proudly around our necks, we got back on the bus and made our way, victorious and full of voice, back to school.

Year 4 PD Program - Make & Sell

This week finally saw the conclusion of our maiden Make and Sell project as part of the Personal Development pilot program in Year 4. The children have followed a process not unlike the ordeal Lord Sugar puts his apprentices through. Tasked with making and selling jewellery, the children created initial ideas, carried out market research, completed order forms, physically manufactured the jewellery by hand, created some promotional materials in the form of posters and a video advert in the marketing task, and finally sold their wares to different year groups in the school. The amount of teamwork, concentration, ingenuity and entrepreneurial skill on display has blown all of the Year 4 staff away. On sales day, we had children coming up with offers and deals on the spot, including a stroke of genius from Emmie &

Mya T in 4Q, who offered an exclusive 'make your own bracelet' experience - in other words, grab some of our unused stock, assemble it yourself so we don't have to, and pay extra for the privilege!! Praise must also go to Toby R in 4Q who managed to convince one child to part with £5 just for one bracelet; he will make a terrific salesman one day I'm sure!! All in all, Year 4 made £174.98 for a local cancer charity, with 4Q coming in victorious with sales of £84.08! All of the children thoroughly enjoyed the entire process and picked up and developed some invaluable skills along the way!
