



Sew Arty is a club that teaches children to develop the creative and valuable life skill of sewing. We primarily teach sewing by hand but, where time allows, we introduce the children to the sewing machine, under strict supervision.

Our aim is to encourage imagination through design and developing sewing skills to produce a finished item whilst also having fun. We are passionate about encouraging personal creativity and the sense of achievement that comes from creation.

One of the most important elements of being creative is the impact it has on our mental health and wellbeing and the 'magic' that happens when we are absorbed in creating and the reward of the final outcome.

The club runs throughout the school year. All equipment and materials are provided. Every child will complete a project to bring home at the end of each half term.
