Dear Parents,

This is more like it. A week of sunshine and outdoor activities has given us confirmation that this is in fact summer term. Indeed, there is a slight air of festival on campus this morning as so many pupils not taking exams or revising immediately ahead of them or recovering from them are out and about in the sort of learning activities at which we excel.

Today parents, grandparents and carers are gathering along the rope to watch their children at Pre Prep Sports Day. It is a time of joy. Reception pupils, guided by Chapter 6 guides, are undertaking several events such as Jelly on a Plate, Sack Race, Paddle Run etc etc. This afternoon we are expecting Chapter 1 and Chapter 2 parents. It is all organised so well and positively, and Ms Shackell continues to glue the entire thing together with her capacity to speak and commentate and direct on the microphone.

The theme of athletic competition and outdoor discovery is literally everywhere. There are the house rounder competitions in the senior school, and today our Prep School is off to play tag rugby at St Margaret's in a large festival.

The Arts Celebration Evening is an event that will showcase the incredible talents of our students in the fields of music, drama, dance, and visual arts.

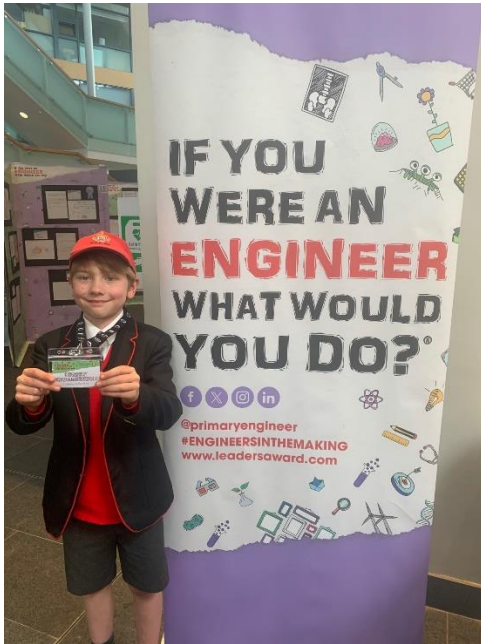

Congratulations to Heidi B and Riley A in Chapter 9 who are the new MSC North West Science and Technology champions of 2024! Travelling to Liverpool Hope University, the participating pupils worked in pairs alongside other schools and took part in a full day of challenging workshops, each targeting a different aspect of STEM. The most challenging was perhaps that involving the programming of Mindstorms robots to navigate a predetermined course. The winners will now go forward to the National STEM Championships next term! A massive well done to all involved.

Beating over 70,000 students nationwide, Liverpool College pupils celebrated massive success on Wednesday in a national Engineering competition.

Pupils had to identify a problem they had observed in real life, invent a solution to that problem, illustrate and annotate their creation, promote their product through a descriptive 'Pitch Letter' and meet a real engineer. We had over 750 students participating in this incredible creative thinking design engineering competition.

This year Liverpool College had ten year-group category winners and a further ten runner-up highly commended entries - the highest number from any one school in the entire North West!
